Toxics in Packaging Clearinghouse July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020

This report summarizes the activities and accomplishments of the Toxics in Packaging Clearinghouse (TPCH) from Ju1y 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020 (FY20). The first section highlights TPCH's accomplishments in FY20. The remainder of the document is organized by major activity as identified in the TPCH work plan.

FY20 HIGHLIGHTS

- Completion of a **one-year screening project on packaging**. Compliance outreach to companies selling and distributing packaging identified as non-compliant in the screening project. Enforcement resulted in the removal of over 6,000 packages containing lead and cadmium from retail stores and product distribution centers in TPCH member states.
- Finalization of a **draft update to the TPCH Model Legislation**. Continued work on this project in FY21 includes a <u>public comment period</u>, revising the draft language, sharing the updated Model Legislation and making all necessary changes to all TPCH outward facing documents and website to reflect the change.
- 32,025 site visits (26,807 of those unique visitors) to the TPCH website in FY20, with an average of 2,669 visitors per month, an increase of 672 visitors per month compared to FY19. There were 81,495 page views on the site, an annual increase of 9,975.
- TPCH received and responded to **47 inquiries** by telephone and email (36 unique inquiries plus 11 follow-up questions), an average of 4 per month.
- Convened a two-day Annual Membership Meeting in Providence, Rhode Island.
- Outreach to non-member state environmental agency commissioners and staff, the National Caucus of Environmental Legislators (NCEL), the Northeast Waste Management Officials' Association (NEWMOA), and more.

TPCH ADMINISTRATION BY PROGRAM MANAGER

- Manages all aspects, but for finances, of organization including coordination and facilitation of monthly two-hour conference calls with members and Executive Committee planning calls.
- Coordinated and convened a 2-day face-to-face annual membership meeting in Providence, Rhode Island October 28-29, 2019. Coordinated travel and conference room for members, prepared and distributed agendas and all other meeting documents before meeting. Five of nine member states attended the meeting in person plus one historical member, 2 member states called in, with guests from the Maine Department of Environmental Protection in person and calling in.

- Recorded and distributed minutes for all conference calls and the annual meeting to members.
- Maintained TPCH electronic file of call and meeting minutes and all other TPCH documents.
- Worked with TPCH Executive Committee to prioritize projects and meeting agendas.
- Prepared and distributed TPCH annual report for FY19.

♦ Program Reporting

- Prepared and distributed to members the FY19 Annual Report (July 1, 2018 June 30, 2019).
- Posted the FY19 Annual Report on the TPCH website.
- Prepared the FY21 budget, which was approved by members in April 2020.

• TPCH Financial Management

TPCH's finances are administered and annually audited as part of the Northeast Recycling Council's operations. The NERC Audit FY20 is available online.

- Revenues in FY20 (\$42,067.61) came in lower than expenses (\$46,045.48).
- TPCH began FY20 with a reserve account balance of \$76,433.30. and ended the fiscal year up with a balance of \$77,948.11.
- TPCH CA SEP funds once again covered member state travel to the annual membership meeting; spending \$2,367.57 of these restricted funds. As of June 30, 2020, the remaining balance in the California SEP account was \$0.00. TPCH was extremely frugal with spending from this account, initially funded in September 2008 with \$50,000 from a California enforcement settlement.

Executive Committee



GENERAL INQUIRIES & EXEMPTION REQUESTS

♦ General Inquiries

TPCH received and responded to 36 unique inquiries by telephone and email, plus 11 follow-up conversations. Each inquiry usually requires multiple emails or phone calls to resolve, and many involve multiple discussions with analysis by TPCH members. The TPCH program manager coordinates all incoming communications from industry, policy makers, advocates and the general population. All inquiries are documented and shared with TPCH members each year.

The bar chart below tracks the number of phone and email inquiries to TPCH from FY17 through FY20. The most frequent inquiries continue to deal with the basic requirements of state toxics in packaging laws; how to obtain a Certificate of Compliance; whether a specific item was considered "packaging" under state laws; and testing of packaging components. Appendix B provides a brief analysis of the general inquiries, focusing on the types of organizations requesting information and assistance.

EDUCATION & OUTREACH


♦ TPCH Website

TPCH had 32,025 site visits to the Toxics in Packaging Clearinghouse website in FY20, an average of 2,669 visitors per month, an increase of 672 visitors per month compared to FY19. New site visitors made up 90% of the visitors, with 10% returning visitors. There were 81,495 page views on the site, an annual increase of 9,975, averaging 6,791 per month. Consistent with prior years, the top three web page resources most viewed were the Model Legislation, Sample Certificate of Compliance and Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs). There is continued need to maintain the website pages and documents to keep all up to date and accessible to all seeking information on the toxics in packaging laws and how to be in compliance.


The bar chart below tracks the average number of monthly website visitors from FY17 through FY20.
